Steps for ethical problem solving are described with an opportunity to apply the concepts. Particular attention is given to the issue of professional boundaries (dual relationships, self-disclosure, and professional vs. personal values).

This course fulfills the three-hour ethics CE's required for counselors and social workers.

Participants will learn and share ways in which therapy for male clients can and should be conducted in order to maximize outcomes and promote the health of the individual.
