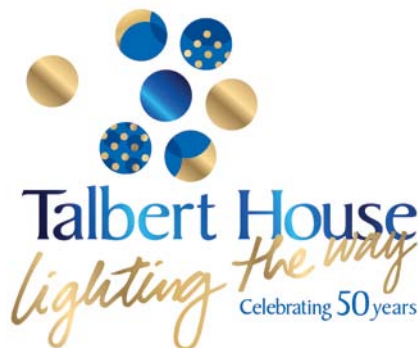

Talbert House Celebrates 50th Anniversary with Gala
Community raises more than \$500,000 for Camp Possible

CINCINNATI—Talbert House celebrated its 50th anniversary with a gala held on Saturday, November 7 for 540 guests at the Hyatt Regency downtown. The gala, chaired by John Silverman, commenced with songs by Seven Hills choir and culminated with a musical concerto by platinum recording pianist David Lanz.

Following the gala, the agency's young professionals board, the Talbert House Ambassadors, hosted an after party at Horseshoe Casino Cincinnati. More than 500 young professionals and community members enjoyed a night of lively entertainment provided by The Rusty Griswolds and DJ Guinness. Attendees enjoyed light bites, sweet treats, photo booths, and a first class silent auction.

The events raised more than \$500,000 to support Camp Possible, an individualized, therapeutic-based summer program from children who need a safe, structured, and stable environment, not just when school is in session. The goal is to help children struggling with behavioral health and substance use issues develop the skills and character necessary to succeed in and out of the classroom. Campers participate in traditional group therapy sessions in the morning and recreational skill building activities in the afternoon.
