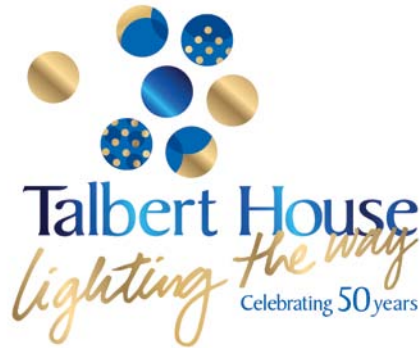

HealthSource of Ohio renews contract with Talbert House

Agency to provide behavioral health staff and integrated care

CINCINNATI— HealthSource of Ohio (HSO) renews an agreement with Talbert House to continue providing behavioral health staff and integrated care to HSO patients in settings across five Ohio counties: Clermont, Brown, Adams, Highland, and Fayette.

Four Talbert House staff, three LISW-S and one LISW, will provide behavioral health services such as individual counseling to those with mental health issues and alcohol or drug addictions. This partnership provides a one-stop-shop for HSO patients who are in need of integrated care services in the regions of Batavia, Goshen, Hillsboro, New Richmond, and Seaman. The agreement will also assist Western Brown school based care, which includes Hamersville Elementary and Middle schools, Mt. Orab Elementary and Middle schools, and Western Brown High School.

Talbert House's President/CEO Neil Tilow said, "We are pleased to continue this strong partnership with HSO to improve the health outcomes for our patients that will positively impact their quality of life."

"HSO is a well-established Federally Qualified Health Center," says Kimberly Patton, President/CEO of HSO, "and Talbert House is well prepared and positioned to continue with this opportunity due to their financial strength and reputation for quality performance and outcomes."

Talbert House is a community-wide nonprofit that operates within five service lines: Adult Behavioral Health, Community Care, Court and Corrections, Housing, and Youth Behavioral Health. Children, adults and families benefit from these proven services. Each year, Talbert House serves almost 36,000 clients face to face and an additional 34,000 are reached through prevention services throughout Greater Cincinnati. The Talbert House mission has two basic purposes: to improve social behavior and enhance personal recovery and growth.

HealthSource of Ohio is a private, not-for-profit Federally Qualified Community Health Center (FQHC) founded in 1976 to address the issues of access to primary health care. HSO serves eight Appalachian counties (Adams, Brown, Clermont, Clinton, Hamilton, Highland, Fayette, and Warren) in 15 offices throughout the service area. HSO employs approximately 50 primary care providers and provides services in Family Practice, Internal Medicine, Pediatrics, Ob/Gyn, Psychiatry, Behavioral Health, Dentistry, and Pharmacy.
