### Women's Fund Committee Awards Grants

HAMILTON, Ohio – The Women's Fund of the Hamilton Community Foundation has announced its grants for 2015, totaling \$19,000. Area organizations receiving grants are:

Boys and Girls Club of Hamilton - \$4,000 for Girls Setting Goals. Beginning in the fall, this program will help 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grade girls learn how to set goals to live a healthier life and understand how food can affect their health.

Primary Health Solutions - \$5,000 for the Butler County Women's Health Initiative, Divalicious Health. This conference kicks off an ongoing initiative to improve the overall health of women in Butler County by providing free health screenings and increasing the awareness of specific health conditions.

Talbert House - \$10,000 for its Moving Beyond Depression program which helps to identify and treat depression in pre- and postnatal mothers.

"We are pleased to collaborate with Every Child Succeeds and Butler County Educational Service Center to provide in-home treatment services to new mothers coping with depression. This funding will allow moms to receive the mental health services they need while ensuring children are in a safe, nurturing environment.
