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Talbert House is the May/June honoree of the Liberty Center's Change for Charity program

LIBERTY TOWNSHIP, OHIO (For Immediate Release) – Throughout May and June, Talbert House will be the charity honoree of the Liberty Center Foundation's Change for Charities program where a portion of parking meter proceeds at Liberty Center benefit local non-profits.

Six charities were chosen by the Foundation earlier this year and they include: Boys and Girls Club of West Chester/Liberty, Reach Out Lakota, Edge Teen Center, Every Child Succeeds and The Dragonfly Foundation along with Talbert House.

Last year, Talbert House served almost 37,500 clients face to face with an additional 28,000 receiving prevention and hotline services.
