



Walnut Hills Anti-Drug Coalition and Talbert House bring community together to address opiate abuse prevention in Cincinnati region

(Cincinnati, OH)- Walnut Hills is making significant strides to chip away at the opioid epidemic impacting the Greater Cincinnati/Northern Kentucky region.

On Wednesday, June 22, the Walnut Hills Anti-Drug Coalition will host a PreventionFIRST! Call to Action Community Forum focused on opioid prevention in partnership with Talbert House at their Executive Office, located at 2600 Victory Parkway starting at 6:00 p.m.

"We are pleased to see a treatment agency partnering with a member coalition to share resources." said Mary Haag, President and CEO of PreventionFIRST!. "This is the 5th PreventionFIRST! Call to Action Community Forum being held throughout Hamilton County so far this year.

Members of the community will hear and interact with a panel of local experts on the topics of opioid prevention, treatment, harm reduction, and supply reduction which includes prescription drugs and heroin. Those in attendance will be given several practical options and strategies they can use to prevent and reduce opiate abuse in their community.

"We are pleased to partner with the Walnut Hills Anti-Drug Coalition to host this important forum," said Neil Tilow, Talbert House President and CEO. "The opportunity to train and have Naloxone kits available for families and friends struggling with addiction makes this a unique event."
