**Talbert House Fights Overdoses with Neighborhood Trainings**

CINCINNATI— Talbert House is hosting several community-based training sessions to combat the heroin epidemic and frequent overdoses occurring in Cincinnati's neighborhood communities.

The training provides guidance related to opioid overdose response and instruction on how to administer the lifesaving drug naloxone, also known by the brand name Narcan®. The non-narcotic medication will be furnished to attendees during each session. All community members and surrounding neighborhoods are encouraged to attend. Upcoming sessions include:

- **Mt. Airy** at St. Therese Little Flower Parish on Thursday, May 4 from 6:00 to 7:30 PM
- **Camp Washington and Northside** at Washington United Church on Wednesday, May 10 from 6:00 to 7:30 PM
- **Corryville, CUF (Clifton Heights, University Heights, & Fairview), and Mt. Auburn** at Crossroads Uptown on Monday, May 15 from 6:00 to 7:30 PM
- **Hartwell and Carthage** at Hartwell Recreation Center on Wednesday, May 17 from 6:00 to 7:30 PM
