Talbert House Programs Receive National Accreditation

American Correctional Association Accreditation Renewed for Five Talbert House Services

CINCINNATI— The American Correctional Association (ACA) recently announced the renewed accreditation of several Talbert House programs at its 2018 Winter Conference. Alcohol and Drug Addiction Partnership Treatment (ADAPT), Burnet Intensive Services (BIS), Pathways, Spring Grove Center, and Serenity Hall were granted the three-year accreditation award after completing an audit that reviewed the services, programs, health care, and security operations essential to the effective management of each facility.

According to the ACA, Talbert House is one of more than 1,500 correctional organizations currently involved in the accreditation process. The ACA accreditation program is a professional peer review process based on national standards that have evolved since the founding of the Association in 1870. The standards were developed by national leaders from the field of corrections, law, architecture, health care, and other groups who are interested in sound correctional management.

The five Talbert House programs receiving ACA accreditation offer varying forms of residential treatment and services to clients throughout the community. Through this achievement, the Agency is able to maintain a balance between protecting the public and providing an environment that safeguards the life, health, and safety of everyone involved in these programs.
