Talbert House Transitions 36 Staff and 1,000 Clients fromCentral Community Health Board



Kamaria Tyehimba, Vice President of Behavioral Health, led the transition As a regional diversity leader in behavioral health and chemical dependency treatment In the Greater Cincinnati area, The Central Community Health Board of Hamilton County (CCHB) offered services in behavioral health treatment and prevention with adult outpatient services, community psychiatric supportive treatment, crisis stabilization, day treatment and opioid treatment programming.

CCHB provided specialized behavioral health services to predominately African American communities, especially those underserved by traditional health care systems. The mission was to provide leadership and comprehensive behavioral health programs for the community to achieve their greatest potential and well-being. In 2019, CCHB joined with Harbor, a national mental health provider, based in Northern Ohio.

In the fall of 2022, Harbor, Inc. made the decision to discontinue services offered in Hamilton County by the Central Community Health Board (CCHB) effective December 16, 2022. Harbor approached Talbert House, as both organizations offer mental and behavioral health services, to plan for a seamless transition and ensure current CCHB clients would be able to continue receiving treatment. Careful planning allowed almost 1,000 CCHB clients to transition treatment services to Talbert House with minimal disruption. Similarly, 36 CCHB employees were offered the opportunity to maintain employment and continue serving their respective clients through Talbert House.

With a very short timeline, a team of professionals across clinical, compliance, human resources and facilities departments directed the strategic transition and integration of CCHB staff and services such as the Opioid Treatment Program (OTP), Mental Health Crisis Stabilization, substance use outpatient services and residential family care homes.
