

Second Chance Symposium

Talbert House was proud to sponsor the Second Chance Symposium alongside KMK Law and Fifth Third Bank. During the event, Governor DeWine highlighted the crucial role of offering employment opportunities to individuals with involvement in the justice system. The program featured insights from Cincinnati business leaders, including Rodney McMullen, Chairman and CEO of The Kroger Co., Marcus Sheanshang, CEO of JBM Packaging, and Eric Wellinghoff, President of Nehemiah Manufacturing, who shared success with second chance hiring as a key component to strengthening the workforce. OTP Team

An Opioid Treatment Program (OTP) is a behavioral health treatment service licensed by the state and federal government for the treatment of Opioid Use Disorder. The OTP team provides methadone (a proven medication preventing withdrawal and cravings), therapy, case management, and family support. Talbert House OTP opened within the Addictions Service Line when Central Community Health Board closed. The team of 9 can serve up to 120 clients at OTP.
